# SOUTHWEST FLORIDA

### CHARLOTTE COUNTY

Webb Lake is a man-made lake that stretches across 395 acres and has fish feeders to assist anglers. Abundant largemouth bass swim in Webb Lake and can be hooked with top water lures, spinnerbaits, plastic worms and crankbaits. Bluegill gather near fish feeders and prefer baits of crickets or red wigglers. Bluegill and redear sunfish spawn until the end of summer and can be found around vegetation until water temperatures drop.

Snook roam the waters of Webb Lake in autumn, but become less active during late fall and winter. They can be caught with artificial bait. Snook harvest is prohibited May through August and December 15 through January.

The 100-mile Peace River flows through Southwest Florida. A highly regarded canoeing river, it offers bass and catfish, both of which hide in deep holes. Snook, which migrate from Gulf waters through Charlotte Harbor, can be caught year-round and also stay in deep holes. Tarpon fishing enthusiasts enjoy the lower Peace River, which has a good supply of the species.

#### HENDRY COUNTY

There are many access points to Lake Okeechobee in the Southwest Florida town of Clewiston, including private marinas and a few public launching ramps and city docks.

#### SARASOTA & MANATEE COUNTIES

Largemouth bass, panfish and tasty catfish are specialties of the Myakka River, which can be accessed from Myakka River State Park and other ramps downstream. The park's pier is handicap accessible and has a roof, enhancing angler comfort. Snook also wander the waters throughout the lower river, especially during fall and winter.

The Manatee River provides fishing enthusiasts with just the place for catching largemouth bass, as well as snook, bream and catfish.

Lake Manatee is a 2,500-acre reservoir created by damming a portion of the Manatee River. Largemouth bass, catfish and crappie are local favorites, and sunshine bass are plentiful near flooded creek beds.

#### **SANIBEL ISLAND**

Snook fishing is good in the Gulf of Mexico off Sanibel Island. Snook prefer the area's warm waters and cover of the mangroves. Snapper and seatrout hide among the mangrove roots, waiting for an opportunity to ambush their prey. Live sardines, pinfish and shrimp are effective baits for going after these saltwater game fish. The main challenge for anglers is preventing the fish from retreating back into the safety of the mangroves once they have been hooked.

#### **NAPLES**

One location where anglers catch permit is in the warm waters near *Naples*. Permit have keen eyesight, making them a challenge to hook in the shallow backwaters. Once hooked, permit put up a furious fight, easily taking 150 yards of line. Many anglers believe that permit are the hardest fighting fish in the sea. Effective baits for permit include fiddler crabs, shrimp and pinfish, as well as artificial lures.

Anglers trolling around *Naples* can catch Spanish mackerel, king mackerel and bluefish. Wahoo can be found offshore in waters more than 100 feet deep. Wahoo move into the warm South Florida waters during the winter months and congregate near structures such as reefs and wrecks.

#### **MARCO ISLAND**

The largest island in the *Ten Thousand Islands National Wildlife Refuge*, *Marco Island*, is one of the best places to fish in Southwest Florida. The wildlife refuge consists of a series of islands, bays and winding channels that interconnect in the

region just south of Naples. The variety of sea life inhabiting these areas includes snook, tarpon, redfish, seatrout, snapper, grouper, shark, tripletail, pompano, mackerel and Goliath grouper. Baits that work successfully for many of these species include crab and shrimp.

#### **SARASOTA**

Snook fishing near *Sarasota* is best February through May as water temperatures rise. Snook may be caught along the edges of rivers and creeks, using baits of shrimp, sardines and minnows. Spring also is the best season to find redfish, seatrout, pompano, tarpon and cobia along the beaches. Effective baits for permit include small, live crabs and shrimp and occassionally, artificial lures.


